

# Publications on Botany

A microfiche collection containing almost 500 publications published in leading botanical magazines by the botanists Pius Font y Quer, Carlos Pau, Frère Sennen and Moriz Willkomm. On the reverse side of this leaflet, supplement 2 to the 6th cumulative catalogue on Botany can be found. This supplement contains a list of 9 important botanical serials and monographs.

## Pius Font y Quer (1888-1964)

Pius Font y Quer, who was born at Lleida, was one of Spain's most outstanding and influential botanists this century. This Catalan chemist and military pharmacist founded the Institut Botànic in Barcelona and carried out extensive studies on the taxonomy of vascular plants of the western Mediterranean. Together with C. Pau and J. Cuatrecasas, he founded the journal *Cavanillesia* and worked as its editor until the start of the Spanish Civil War. His best-known books are *Diccionario de Botánica* (reprinted 11 times) and *Plantas Medicinales o el Dioscórides renovado*.

## Carlos Pau (1857-1937)

Pau was a botanist and pharmacist from Segorbe (Castellón). Although he had neither financial support nor a position at an institution, he actively collected material throughout Spain and Morocco, thereby creating a valuable herbarium. Through his work he acquired a profound knowledge of the Iberian flora, something which was widely acknowledged by his peers. His many and varied publications include *Contribución a la flora española*, *Notas par la flora española*, *Mis excursiones botánicas*, etc.

## Frère Sennen (1861-1937)

The Frenchman, Frère Sennen, was both a botanist and a clergyman to the "Frères des écoles chrétiennes". He was an extremely active collector - and keen student - of the flora of the Iberian Peninsula, Southern France and Morocco. His renowned *exsiccata* were collected in this area, the material which he distributed was gathered in the course of around 10,000 collecting trips. In the course of his taxonomic work, for which he adopted Jordan's analytical criterion, he described innumerable species.

## Moriz Willkomm (1821-1895)

Originally from Saxony, Willkomm was a botanist who carried out extensive collecting trips in Spain and Portugal. After teaching at a number of German universities, he finally settled in Prague, where he took up the post of director of the university's botanical garden. Together with his Danish co-author, J. Lange, he published *Prodromus florum hispanicae* which remained the most widely-used Spanish flora for more than a century. Willkomm's other major works are *Icones et descriptiones plantarum novarum criticarum et rariorum Europae austro-occidentalis praecipue Hispaniae* and the *Illustrationes florum hispaniae insularumque Balearum*.

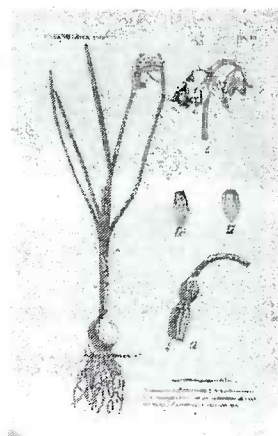


Illustration from: P. Font y Quer, *De flora occidentale adnotaciones*, *Cavanillesia* 5, 1932.
