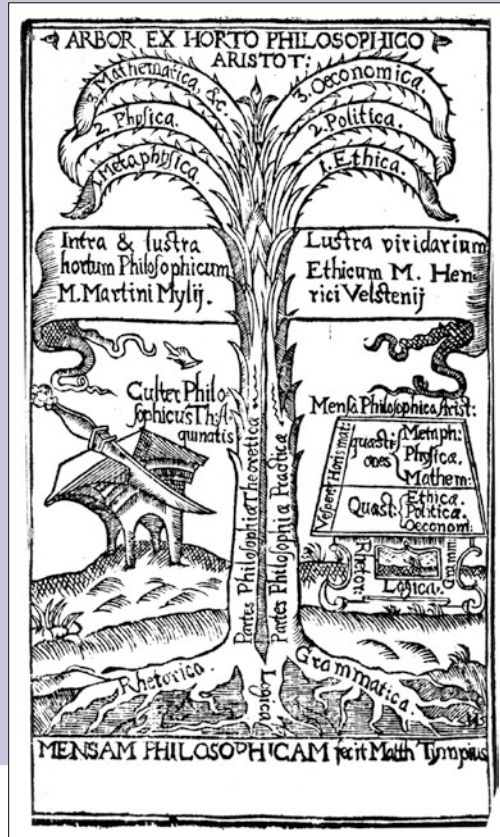

A wide range of rare materials pertaining to the History of Arts, Education, Philosophy and Science, previously dispersed through various sources, is now available as a single collection under Brill's IDC Publishers imprint. This enables researchers readily to access a broad range of textual materials, extending research opportunities.

Broad Range of Subjects

During the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, tens of thousands of students attended schools and universities in Europe. Generally, during this period, students were required to study subjects classified under the disciplines of Philosophy and the Liberal Arts. Philosophy (which comprised both the "sciences" and the "arts") and the Liberal Arts encompass a broad range of subjects, such as Metaphysics, Physics, Mathematics, Ethics, Oeconomica, Politics, Logic, Rhetoric, Grammar, Poetics and History. Individual curricula were developed for specific schools and universities.

Selection of Works

This series focuses on printed works from the sixteenth, seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Works held by libraries in Europe and North America, as well as works held in various European archives, are to be made accessible in this collection. They include textbooks, disputations, orations and curriculum plans. In selecting works for this series, the focus is on materials that enhance our general knowledge

of Philosophy, the Liberal Arts, and Education during this period. It includes many works which are pedagogically informative, or especially rare.

Early Modern History and Culture

The works published in this series are of interest to a wide range of researchers studying Early Modern History and Culture, including specialists in Scholastic Philosophy and Historians in the fields of Rhetoric, Linguistics, Political Thought, Science and Mathematics. Musicologists and Theologians will also find the collection valuable. At present, only a very small portion of extant texts in this area is available to modern researchers as reproductions in printed or microfiche form. The publication of this series will therefore open up new areas of research.

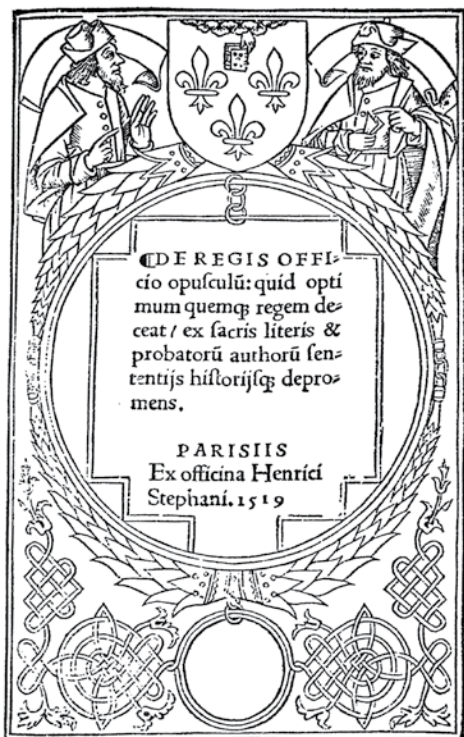
